They came to discuss the opportunity to collaborate with Arapahoe Sertoma in co-sponsoring their annual charity Golf Tournament at Pinehurst Country Club. Southwest Sertoma has only 21 members and needs help with continuing to sponsor the annual charity golf tournament. The tournament has been very successful raising \$65,525 in 2009, \$79,119.99 in 2010 and \$53,287 in 2011. In 2008, Englewood's head football coach, Randy Penn retired after winning Coach of the Year in 3A football.

The sitting councilmember and longtime Englewood Schools coach is seeking re-election.

“I believe I have represented the citizens of Englewood positively and gained great insight on the interworking of the city,” he said.

Penn and his family have lived in Englewood since 1955.

The veteran community activist has been a liaison for Code Enforcement. He also served on the Englewood Transportation Advisory Committee, the Library Board, the Englewood City/School Committee and was the city’s representative to the Denver Regional Council of Government.

For three years, he was chairman of the Greater Englewood Chamber of Commerce.

“I am committed to my hometown Englewood,” he said. “My re-election to City Council will help ensure that the community values I have promoted over the last four years will continue to provide citizens with a proud and positive Englewood.”

City Council selects Randy Penn to serve as Englewood's Mayor

The four City Council members re-elected in the November 1, 2011 Election were sworn in during the November 7, 2011 Englewood City Council meeting. District 1 representative Joe Jefferson, District 3 representative Randy Penn, and At-Large representatives Bob McCaslin and Jill Wilson all took the Oath of Office administered by Judge Vincent Atencio. The Council members were elected to serve four-year terms.

City Council also selected a new Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem during the meeting. Randy Penn was selected to serve as Mayor and Jim Woodward, who has served as Englewood's Mayor for the last four years, was chosen as Mayor Pro Tem. The Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem are selected by City Council from among its members and serve in these positions for a period of two years, in accordance with the City of Englewood’s Charter.
